All Saints is working to improve and increase ministry to future college students from SRU and Grove City College. J and Y came to Flint last week because J had an exam to take in Ann Arbor. I invited them to join me for our worship service on Sunday, which they did. J's response after the service was that it was very similar to his grandma's service. He took a video of our church, and by the time they arrived at my home for dinner, he had already sent the video to his grandmother!
